- A 964.7 per cent increase in profit after tax from Rs. 833.8 lac in 2003-04 to Rs. 8877.3 lac in 2004-05.






Sugar production (lac/quintal)




Revenue (Rs./lac)





EBIDTA (Rs./lac)

Sugar refinery

- First company in India to install a sugar refinery.

Dear Shareholders

It gives me satisfaction to report that The Dhampur Sugar Mills Limited reported the highest profit in its existence during 2004-05, the financial year under review. This profit of Rs. 5568.74 lac was 135.87 per cent higher than the next-nearest profit in the history of the Company.

Before one gets into the soul of these numbers, it might be pertinent to understand how Dhampur's pursuit of growth was temporarily interrupted in the mid-Nineties:

• In response to India's sugar consumption growing at the

fastest rate in the world, the Company mobilised debt to commission or acquire four plants in quick succession (commissioning of refined sugar and co-gen plants at Rauzagaon, sugar mill at Asmoli, chemical plant at Dhampur, takeover of the Mansurpur and Kashipur mills and the expansion and modernization of the sugar plant at Dhampur).

 Unexpectedly, this expansion coincided with a sharp increase in the government-dictated prices of raw material, sugar oversupply, declining sugar realisations and depressed profitability.
