DIRECTORS' REPORT

Members,

Your Directors take great pleasure in presenting the company's 34th Annual Report together with Audited Accounts and Auditors' Report thereon for the financial year ended 31st March, 2000.

OPERATIONS

The year 1999-2000 was another year of improved performance:

The highlight of the year under report was the record level of Lead-Zinc Concentrate production from captive mines of the company. The Rampura-Agucha Mine established new production records, operating over its installed capacity.

During the year record Zinc metal production was achieved. Two of its Electrolytic Zinc Smelters, viz. Debari and Vizag continued to operate over their annual rated capacities. The Chanderiya Smelter achieved 85% capacity utilization for Zinc metal production, which is higher than previous year's (80%) and also highest since inception. Lead metal production at Chanderiya and Tundoo Smelters was 6% higher than the last year. Your Board has approved the closure of Vizag Lead Plant which has been retired from operation.

MARKETING

Zinc metal sale during the year 1999-2000 surpassed all earlier records, despite increased competition from the off-shore suppliers. Lead metal sale also registered an 11% growth over the previous year. This performance was accomplished by well planned and executed marketing strategy.

Your company exported 30,062 tonnes Zinc Concentrate, valuing 8.99 million US Dollars equivalent to Rs. 38.81 crores during the year under report.

FINANCIAL

Your company achieved a record sales turnover of Rs. 1515.60 crores registering an increase of about 16% over the last year. The company earned a pre-tax net profit of Rs. 182.17 crore, showing a rise of 20.5% over the preceeding year.

Your Directors were pleased to recommend an interim-cum-final dividend of Rs. 25.80 crore (including Tax) for the financial year 1999-2000, compared to Rs. 19.75 crore for the financial year 1998-99. The total amount was already disbursed.

The liability on account of second

and last trench of Rs. 80 crore Bonds was redeemed in September, 1999 on the due date without any borrowings, making your company a "Zero debt" company.

Your company had provided an amount of Rs. 65 crore to General Reserve.

The deposits under the Public Deposit Scheme of the company as on 31st March, 2000 stood at Rs. 7.01 crore, compared to Rs. 5.40 crores as on 31st March, 1999.

FOREIGN EXCHANGE OUTGO / EARNINGS

The Foreign Exchange Outgo on technical know-how. basic engineering, raw-materials, stores spares, capital goods, travelling expenses etc. during the year was Rs. 41.72 crores. Your company earned foreign exchange of 8.99 million US Dollars, equivalent to Rs. 38.81 crore through the export of concentrate.

ACCOMPLISHMENT

Accorded "Mini Ratna" status in October, 1999.

"Excellent" performance rating under MoU for the year 1999-2000.

Awarded Gold Medal to Zawar Group of mines for outstanding "Productivity" for the year 1998-99 by Indian Institute of Industrial Engineering.

PROJECTS

(a) Sindesar Khurd Lead-Zinc Prospect

The Sindesar Khurd Lead-Zinc prospect in Rajsamand District, Rajasthan is being developed as a replacement mine of



Rajpura-Dariba with a capacity to produce 1000 tpd ore, at an estimated cost of Rs. 92 crores. The contract for pre-production development and excavation of ramp have since been awarded.

(b) Kayar Lead-Zinc Prospect

Your company had obtained mining lease for 4.87 sq.km. area for the Kayar Lead-Zinc prospect in Ajmer district, Rajasthan. The scheme has been formulated to undertake detailed exploration involving about 16800 m of drilling, metallurgical test work, ground water survey etc. The drilling is in progress since June, 1999. So far 2963 metres of drilling has been completed and the preliminary reports of ore zone intersections are The drilling encouraging. operations are expected to be completed during the year 2001-2002.

(c) Zinc Smelters Expansion

The expansion of Vizag and Debari Zinc Smelters are in progress. These projects are likely to be mechanically completed during the quarter January-March, 2001.

(d) New Zinc Smelter

The investment proposal of Rs. 1132.34 crore for 100,000 tonnes per annum Greenfield Smelter has been submitted to the Government of India for PIB and CCEA approval. The project is expected to be completed within 48 months from the date of Government approval. The final comprehensive EIA/EMP report has been received from the consultant.

The application with MoEF has been filed for environment clearance of the project.

(e) Nickel Technology Proving Plant

The Nickel Technology Proving Plant for recovery of Nickel from low grade lateritic chromite overburden dumps at the Sukinda Valley in Orissa State was mechanically completed in September, 1999. The plant is in operation to firm up the operating parameters.

EXPLORATION AND R&D

(a) GRASS ROOT EXPLORATION

A scheme was drawn for the grass root exploration of leadzinc and associated minerals in the Ajmer region, Rajasthan. 2344.37 Out of sq.km. prospecting license area, 1835 sq.km. area was considered geologically prospective for airborne survey. 1458 sq.km. area was subjected to airborne geophysical survey employing Geotem Technology covering 3900 line km. Helicopter-borne survey is planned for the remaining area for which permission from DGCA is awaited.

(b) JAGPURA GOLD PROSPECT

In Jagpura Prospect, district Banswara, Rajasthan, detailed exploration for gold is in progress since January, 1995. A detailed exploration envisaging 5000 meters of drilling was initiated for delineation of gold resources and gold content alongwith mineralogical and metallurgical characterisation. Currently,

exploration efforts are being concentrated in I&J targets in SE and SW blocks.

(c) RESEARCH & DEVELOPMENT

Your company attaches great importance to continuous upgradation of technology to reduce cost of production, improve productivity & product quality and recovery of metal values from wastes and residues through its Research and Development Centre. Your company also continues to undertake R&D projects in collaboration with other National and Overseas R&D Institutes of repute.

Some of the major R&D activities in progress are :

Simultaneous production of copper sulphate solution and cobalt metal from wastes/residues generated in zinc smelters; studies on improvement in cobalt metal recoverv by creating additional facilities in the solvent extraction plant under TIFAC scheme; amenability studies on gold ore for metal winning.

Another significant R&D activity of your company in progress is the establishment of pilot plant facilities for developing process flow sheet to recover cobalt, nickel and copper from ocean bed manganese nodules in collaboration with Department Ocean Development, Government of India and Regional Research Laboratory, Bhubaneswar. The pilot plant is expected to be completed by May, 2001.



TECHNOLOGY ABSORPTION

Information in respect of technology absorption under Research & Development as per Section 217-(1)-(e) of the Companies Act, 1956 duly filled in the prescribed format is annexed.

ENVIRONMENT MANAGEMENT

The various pollution control measures are operating effectively maintaining ambient air quality and effluent discharge at your company's smelters, mines and townships as per the norms.

In line with Company's Environment Policy, your company is constructing an improved facility for storage of Jarosite waste at Debari Smelter at a cost of Rs. 12 crore, which would be first of its kind in the country. The project is expected to be completed during the quarter January - March 2001.

In order to improve environment and reduction of dust emissions in sinter plant at Tundoo Lead Smelter, your company is installing bag filter system, which is expected to be completed by December, 2000.

In view of acute shortage of water at certain units, your company had taken a number of initiatives aimed at conserving water in all its operations by better water management.

ENERGY CONSERVATION

Various energy conservation measures taken up by your company during the reporting year have helped to gain overall saving in energy to the tune of Rs. 99.54 lakhs.

The following measures were taken with a view to conserve energy in different operations of the company:

- Load & Energy Management.
- Measurement & Monitoring the consumption of various forms of energy.
- Energy audit and survey.
- Plugging of losses in energy usage.
- Sizing of equipment.
- Optimization of system power factor.
- Process improvement/ modification.
- Use of energy efficient system and equipment.

OFFICIAL LANGUAGE POLICY OF THE COMPANY

Various measures had been taken by your company for implementing and propagating official language policy. All the units remained quite active and committed for 100% compliance of Rajbhasha Act.

PERSPECTIVE PLAN

Your company selected Andersen Consulting, a world's largest consulting organization to undertake benchmarking exercise in its existing operations and also as a facilitator to prepare Perspective Plan for the next 20 years. This has been undertaken to improve existing operations, and prepare a long term perspective plan to enable your company to retain its competitive edge and enhance shareholder's value.

HUMAN RESOURCES

Your company is making continuous efforts to improve employees competence, moral and effectiveness, which are essential for organizational achievements. In the present liberalized economic scenario, such efforts are critical not only

for survival but also to sustain and growth of organization. Keeping this into consideration, your company had formulated a plan to fulfill the present and future organizational requirements of human resources.

The manpower employed at the end of the reporting year was 11496 as against 11851 during the last year. Out of the total employees on roll, 1816 belonged to SC, 1502 to ST, 178 to ExServicemen and 63 to handicapped categories.

INDUSTRIAL RELATIONS

The company's track record of cordial industrial relation was maintained during the year under report.

SOCIAL OBLIGATIONS

Your company has been playing an important role in undertaking various social welfare activities. During the year under report, your company had contributed for the common good of people both for Regional and National cause. The significant contribution made by the company are as follows:

- Contribution of Rs. 50 lakhs in favour of "National Defence Fund" as the company's humble expression of gratitude to our valiant Armed Forces. Employees also contributed one day's salary, amounting to Rs. 30 lakhs in support of the Armed Forces.
- An amount of Rs. 75 lakhs was contributed towards "Prime Minister's Relief Fund" for Orissa super cyclone which caused sufferings to large population.
- As a relief measure to the drought in Rajasthan, approximately a sum of



Rs. 65 lakhs was spent on fodder and drinking water.

VIGILANCE

Your company continued its vigilance activities through strategies such as encompassing surveillance on corruption prone areas. adopting prevention method by streamlining rules and procedures and taking deterrent action wherever necessary.
