FINANCIAL RESULTS

The Company posted a net loss of Rs.3.84 lacs in the current financial year as against a net loss of Rs.3.89 lacs during the previous year. The leaf spring division is defunct and is closed since last 9 years.

DIVIDEND

Your Directors do not recommend any dividend for the year ended 31st March, 2006, due to losses suffered by the Company.

DEPOSITS

The Company has not accepted any deposits during the year ended on 31st March 2006 under section 58A of the Companies Act, 1956, read with the Companies (Acceptance of Deposits) Rules, 1975 and there are no outstanding, overdue, unclaimed or unpaid deposits at the end of the year.
