DIVIDEND:

In view of Financial Results of the company, your Directors, are unable to recommend any dividend for the year under review. The company shares are listed at Ludhiana, New Delhi, Bombay and Jaipur stock exchanges. The company has paid the listing fees to all the Stock Exchanges.

FINANCIAL POSITION

The net tangible worth of the company is Rs.605.62 lacs as on 31.03.2001. The total capital employed by the company as on 31.03.2001 is Rs.1139.60 lacs.

The company has not accepted any Fixed Deposits from the Public u/s. 58A of the Compnes Act during the year under report .

OPERATIONS:

Due to increased competition from Imported Edible Oils during the year under review the sales of Vanaspati & Refined oils declined as compared to previous year. The margins were also under constrain as a result of which the company incurred losses during the year under review.

However, the company has the potential to bounce back, as the brand "ANGAN" under which the company is selling its products enjoys a good reputation in the State of Himachal Pradesh and infact has captured a major share of the vanaspati market in the state.

DIRECTORS:

Shri Vinod Arora and Shri Gurcharan Arora, Directors retire by rotation and being eligible, offer themselves for re-appointment. During the year Sh. Hardyal Doegar was appointed as an additional Director under section 260 of the companies act. The company has received the notice under section 257 of the companies act proposing the appointment of Sh. Hardyal Doegar as regular director, Sh. Gurcharan Arora & Sh. Atul Jain resigned from the Whole Time Director and Directorship of the company and HPSIDC withdraw the nomination of Sh. B.S. Chauhan as director of the company. The expertise and invaluable guidance of Shri B.S. Chauhan & Sh. Atul Jain had helped the company to a great extent in forging ahead. The Board places on record its deep appreciation and gratitude for the valuable advice, guidance, assistance and services rendered by Shri B.S. Chauhan & Sh. Atul Jain during their tenure on the board.
