NOTICE TO SHAREHOLDERS

Notice is hereby given that the 56th Annual General Meeting of the Members of TCM Limited will be held on Thursday, the 28th day of September, 2000 at 14.00 Hrs at Bharat Hotel, Ernakulam to transact the following business.

ORDINARY BUSINESS

1. To receive, consider and adopt the Directors' Report, the Audited Balance Sheet, the Profit & Loss Account for the year ended 31st March, 2000 and the Report of the Auditors thereon.
2. To appoint a Director in the place of Shri. R.V Ramani who is retiring by rotation. The retiring Director is eligible for reappointment.
3. To appoint a Director in the place of Shri. R.B.Kishore who is retiring by rotation. The retiring Director is eligible for reappointment.
4. To appoint Auditors for the ensuing year and to fix the remuneration, by passing the following resolution, with or without modification as a Special Resolution:

"RESOLVED that Messrs. Sankaran & Raman, Chartered Accountants be and are hereby reappointed as Auditors of the Company, to hold office from the conclusion of this Annual General Meeting until the conclusion of the next Annual General Meeting on a fee of Rs. 60,000/- (Rupees Sixty thousand only) plus actual travelling and halting expenses incurred by them"

NOTES

1. In connection with the General Meeting, the Register of Members and Share Transfer Books of the Company will be closed from 19-9-2000 to 28-9-2000 (both days inclusive).
2. A member entitled to attend and vote at the meeting is entitled to appoint one or more proxies to attend and vote instead of himself. A proxy need not be a member of the Company. Completed proxy forms should reach the Registered Office of the Company before 14.00 Hrs on 26-9-2000.
3. Members are requested to intimate change of address, if any, immediately to the Company at its Registered Office quoting their folio numbers.
4. Pursuant to Section 205A of the Companies Act, 1956 all unclaimed/unpaid dividends upto the year 1993-94 have been transferred to the General Revenue Account of the Central Government. DIRECTORS' REPORT

Your Directors have pleasure in presenting the 56th Annual Report with Audited Accounts for the year ended 31st March, 2000.

FINANCIAL RESULTS

The Company has achieved a Turnover of Rs.4488 lakhs as compared to Rs. 4808 lakhs last year. After providing for depreciation of Rs. 102 lakhs finance charges of Rs. 215 lakhs the operations have resulted in a loss of Rs. 245 lakhs as compared to the profit of Rs.14 lakhs last year. After adjusting last year's surplus brought forward amounting to Rs.44 lakhs, the loss set off against General Reserve is Rs.201 lakhs.

OPERATIONS

The Company's operations were affected by the fall in margins on account of steep rise in both power tariff and fuel costs. While power tariff hike affected chlorates, the steep increase in price of lecofines and furnace oil impacted on Barium Chemicals. The inability to take up selling prices, resulted in major erosion in margins. Moreover the prices had also to be reduced to keep in step with prices of imported chemicals. In this context Government of India has imposed an anti dumping duty on Barium Carbonate of Chinese origin and this will result in better performance in the coming years. The doubling of excise duty on pesticides in general and Copper Sulphate in particular as also Sales Tax hikes affected company's turnover in the IVth quarter of the year. The Company's operations resulted in a loss for the first time in the last 13 years. Appropriate measures are being taken to remedy the situation.

DIVIDEND

In view of the above, the Directors do not recommend payment of dividend to its shareholders for the year 1999-2000.

PUBLIC DEPOSITS

As of 31st March, 2000 Five deposits amounting to Rs.15000 remained unclaimed.

PARTICULARS OF EMPLOYEES

The appointment of Auditors has to be made by special resolution in terms of section 224A of the Companies Act 1956.
