
MAJOR HPS AHLUWALIA CLIMBED MOUNT EVEREST IN 1965.

"I knew what I was bowling," he says. "But some batsmen could not because they could not see the ball in my polio-



So when Roger Bannister said he would attempt one, he needed a lot of support. Literally. Two colleagues agreed to pace him through the race.

Brasher set the pace, Bannister ran second, Chataway positioned himself third. Brasher ran the first 220 yards in a fraction over 27 seconds. They did half the mile in a minute and 58

seconds.

Now came the crucial half. Bannister's reputation was that he could sustain his pace for the last 200 yards. But into the home stretch his body pleaded with him to stop but his spirit impelled him to go on. When he finished, he collapsed into the arms of waiting spectators.

A few minutes later, the impresario announced: "The time is three..."

Bannister had run the mile in 3.59.4 minutes.

The remarkable thing is the impact that it produced. After Bannister had demolished the psychological barrier, hundreds of athletes proceeded to run the mile under four minutes over the next few decades.
